Judges and Presenters

Eve Auch has been involved in Dobermans for forty years. Her husband, Roger, and she have bred under the name of Irongate and to date have 33 champions with 25 of them being ROM dogs. She started out in obedience (where she's put more than four dozen titles on dogs), then migrated to the conformation ring. Other areas then began to interest her - tracking, therapy, search and rescue, and protection work. This led her to the DPCA's Register of Merit program in 1990. Shortly after that she became a WAE evaluator and has been for almost two decades. During that time she has been the Chair of the ROM Committee, the ROM Coordinator, and has written and edited the current manual. "There is nothing more satisfying than being on the course evaluating dogs and interacting with their handlers. I look forward to my assignment as part of the UDC National."

Diane Bauman has been training dogs for 35 years. Her accomplishments are numerous and include: Being chosen to participate on the AKC World Agility Team for three years in a row with an American Cocker Spaniel. This is the same dog that also earned the third MACH of all time/breeds. She made history by training the first Afghan Hound with MX and MXJ titles. There was no MACH at that time. This same dog also had multiple High In Trial awards in AKC obedience. She has a MACH 4 on her rescued Border Collie "Luca." She trained the first and only OTCH Pekingese which she rescued from an animal shelter. "Abra" was a black Pomeranian, rescued at the age of 6 who also went on to become an Obedience Trial Champion. Diane has four tracking titles on four different breeds. She trained the first American/Canadian OTCH Keeshond with a tracking title. She got this dog when it was 4 years old and had already been in other homes. She has earned 16 perfect scores of 200 in obedience with four different breeds of dogs. Has owner handled a dog to a Lure Coursing Championship, two dogs to breed Championships, and one dog to an AKC Herding Championship. She has the first Icelandic Sheepdog in history to hold AKC herding titles in both test and trial classes. Diane is the author of Beyond Basic Dog Training (Howell 2003), now in its third revision and Agility Start To Finish (Alpine) recently released in 2008. She has produced two DVD's. The first is The Obedience Retrieve for all Breeds and the second is called Directed Retrieve and Scent Discrimination. To say she has done it all is an understatement! Students flock from all over to consult her on the most difficult training issues. She watches, listens with care, asks questions and leads her students to find the answers. A behaviorist, an author of numerous publications, a public speaker, but most of all a great teacher.

Dr. Joseph M. Bulo is an orthopedic surgeon specializing mainly in the treatment of sports injuries by means of "arthroscopic surgery". His affinity for our Breed started in 1978 when he acquired his first Doberman after having had many dogs of different breeds through my childhood. In 1982 he established his kennel "DE GARRAF", obtaining results gradually with several Spanish, German and French Champions as well as winning titles such as Jugend Europa Sieger and Jugend IDC Sieger. Various other dogs from his breeding were placed in the top four at different IDC, DV and World Championship Shows.

His initial attraction to the Doberman was its character and he enjoyed participating in various working disciplines and training courses as well as organizing courses in Spain with training specialists. He has passed the ZTP with eight Dobermanns, and has participated in 53 Schutzhund and IPO trials, 34 of which at level III with ten Dobermanns. He also participated in the DV Meisterschaft in '90,'93,'94,'95 and '96 as well as in the IDC Meisterschaft in '96 and '97 obtaining the third place in the DV '94 and '96 and the IDC '97, best protection in DV '95 with 96 points, best protection in the HSVRM '94 (all breeds) with 98 points. His highest score ever obtained at level III is 100-97-100.

His judging career is as follows: Internationally licensed Breed judge since 1990, DV licensed ZTP for LOE Dobermanns since 1993, IPO licensed judge since 1996, Sch H (VPG) licensed judge DV & VDH since 1998, judge for IPO and VPG - RCEPPA Spanish German Sheepdog. He has judged several DCE Spanish Breed Championship Shows, Club Championship Shows in Belgium, Greece, Finland, Sweden, Italy, German DV, France, South Africa, Indonesia, Mexico, several IDC, The Europa-Sieger and The Europe Championship. He has also judged several ZTPs, several working trials in various countries, several IDC "Weltmeisterschaft", The Spanish all breed Championship, Spanish German Sheepdog trials and Italian Malinois Championship.

He was president for The Spanish Doberman Club DCE from 1995 until 2000.

Beth Bishop, CPDT, has been a Rally fanatic for several years. She is an APDT Rally representative, a prospective judge, and teaches Rally Obedience classes. She is co-owner of a dog training business that sponsors 2 weekends of APDT and C-Wags Rally trials each year. Beth has trained, competed with and titled her Dobermans in APDT, C-Wags and UKC Rally.

Ray Carlisle purchased his first Doberman in 1961. He has developed a successful breeding program under the kennel name CARA; striving for the TOTAL Doberman. Ray became an AKC licensed judge in 1981 and has had the honor of judging several National Specialties here in America and around the world. He is licensed to judge Doberman Pinschers, German Pinschers, Great Danes, and Jr. Showmanship. A founding member of the UDC, Ray has served two separate terms as President and many years on the board. Ray is a past president of the DPCA and the AWDF. He currently is president of Tri-State Doberman Club host of this year's UDC National. Ray presently serves on the DPCA ROM committee and is a ROM evaluator. Edie DeMaria, VMD (of Pets Aloud Mobile Vet) is a 1998 graduate of the School of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. She completed an internship at Oradell Animal Hospital (OAH) in small animal medicine and surgery. She continued at OAH as a Staff Doctor until July 2009, dividing her practice between surgery and general care. Dr. DeMaria has maintained a special interest in pain management, including acupuncture when appropriate. Edie's outside interests include natural horsemanship, skiing, and hiking with her three dogs, daughter and husband. She is active in the Australian Shepherd Club of America, American Quarter Horse Association and the Audubon Society.

Mahlon Goer is a board member of the Dog Federation of New York, an organization dedicated to assuring dog-friendly, dog-safe communities for all New Yorkers. The organization monitors laws and proposed legislation on behalf of caring dog owners across the state.

Butch Henderson has over 30 years experience training, breeding, and handling both companion and competition dogs. He is experienced as a Bomb Dog Handler (Garrison & Sloan, Inc. - Baltimore and NYC - 2000-2003) and is the training director for the Commonwealth Working Dog Club - 1992-present. He is a member of DVG America, United Schutzhund Clubs of America, American Doberman Association, United Doberman Club and the Commonwealth Working Dog Club. His many accomplishments include: Representing the United States at the 2004 & 2006 FCI IPO World Championships, 1996, 2002, 2004, & 2005 dhv Deutsche Meisterchaft (German Championship), and 2005 & 2006 DV Doberman IPO World Championships, 1996 & 2005 DVG America National Champion, 2004 AWDF National Champion (3rd Place, 2006), 2002 & 2004 DVG America National Vice-Champion and titling multiple breeds in Schutzhund, including Bouviers, Dobermans, German Shepherds, Rottweilers, Pit Bulls, and American Bulldogs.

Dr. May Jacobson resides in Sudbury, Massachusetts and has been a Doberman fancier for 40 years. During that period she has bred, under the kennel name Chalmar, or owned the sire of over 30 American Champions and among them two multi-all-breed Best in Show winners. Her interests have extended to working dogs with the participation in the Sport of Schutzhund. She is the breeder of the second Doberman ever to achieve an American championship and Schutzhund 3 title. Owner handled. She and her Doberman twice qualified to be a participant on the working team that represented America at the FCI World Championships. She was the first American to put a Life Time Korung, owner handled, on a Doberman.

She is licensed to judge most of the Working Group and has judged these breeds in Germany, Scandinavia, Europe, Australia, Asia and South America and Canada. She has been elected five times by the membership of the Doberman Pinscher Club of America to judge the National Specialty. Her club activities include serving on the Board of Directors of the Doberman Pinscher Club of America, President of an all breed club, President of the Pilgrim Doberman Pinscher Club, and is presently on the Board of the DPCA and Pilgrim DPC. She is a founding member of the United Doberman Club.

Dr. Jacobson received her Doctorate degree in Biochemistry and is a medical staff member in the Department of Hematology at Children's Hospital and Harvard Medical School in Boston. She has numerous publications in the field of Hematology.

Sue King has been an obedience judge for over 25 years. "it's been a great pleasure to meet so many wonderful dogs and owners." She's personally put obedience and tracking degrees on her dogs which included her beautiful Doberman, Tonka, as well as her German Shepherds. Her life is taken up by a full time accounting position, judging obedience for the AKC and rescue work with Our Companions Domestic Animal Shelter in CT.

Irene Korotev has been active in SAR since 1984. She has trained 4 of her Dobermans to operational status in air scent, human remains, evidence, trailing, and is currently working toward that goal with her fifth dog. Her operational dog, Jäger, was the DPCA's 2008 SAR Dog of the Year. Irene has been the training officer for Missouri Search & Rescue K-9 for many years.

Judges and Presenters (cont'd)

Norbert Kowal has been an obedience exhibitor for over 15 years and a licensed UKC and ASCA Obedience judge for over 5 years. He has shown Saint Bernards in AKC, UKC and CKC. His multiple titles include UDX, UDX2 along with CH. UKC – UUD and CKC OTCHX. He is currently working with a Cardigan Corgi Pup. He recently judged the UDC Tri-State Doberman Club Regional obedience trial.

Bunny Lanning has trained Dobermans to Utility, Excellent Agility, Schutzhund, Tracking, and Herding titles. Under the Lothlorien kennel, there have been several conformation champions and a Certified Police Dog, in addition to many other working titles. A founding member of UDC, Bunny was President for three years and a board member for many more. She has actively served as a Certified Evaluator for Therapy Dogs International for 17 years. She takes the UDC mission seriously; working, testing and breeding for the total Doberman, sound in mind and body. Her address is 303 S. 13th Street Murray, KY 42071 and email is lorien@apex.net.

Hyman Leibman is a qualified Working Group judge in South Africa. His interest has always been focused on Dobermanns and he has always had and bred only Dobermanns, with his first in 1976, and his Hysand Kennel name registered in 1982. In 1990 he was in Riversands, California where he spent a night with Philip and Linda Calamia and that was where he had my first glimpse of Schutzhund when he accompanied them to an evening at their training club. On that visit he learned about the break away from the DPCA and the formation of the UDC. He purchased a dog sired by one of their dogs and, as he was born in Las Vegas, he named him Hysand Gambler. Hysand went on to a distinguished show career.

He is licensed to judge under the Kennel Union of Southern Africa rules which are fairly strict, and was qualified by the old Dobermann Breed Council Dobermann specialist clubs as a Dobermann specialist judge. He has judged numerous Dobermann specialist shows, including the Dobermann Club of the Cape, and The Dobermann Club (old style) Open Show (only Dobermanns).

Marilyn Lopatich was a teenager when she saw her first Doberman Pinscher. She saw was a proud and beautiful animal and knew one day she would have as a companion. She started going to dog shows in the late 60's, buying dog magazines and books about the Doberman. Seeing and meeting both the owners and their wonderful companions only made her more determined this was her breed. She decided she wanted a bitch from Tess Henseler's Vom Arthal kennel. "Little did I know how long it would take for this to become reality. Many of you may know the history of this woman... tough, determined, outspoken, one of the most devoted, successful and admired breeders of her time. After a year of letters, pictures, and telephone conversations with Tess I was told I could come to Pennsylvania and meet with her. It was clearly understood there was no guarantee I would return home with a puppy. I passed inspection only when her famous stud dog Cassio came and put his head in my lap. I came home with my 'special girl' from a Cassio x Illysa breeding. That was 1969."

She's had a few other breeds in these past forty years but always at least one Dobe. In 1999, she was granted her AKC license to judge the Doberman Pinscher and has since obtained my license to judge the Boxer, Bernese Mountain Dog, Rottweiler, and Siberian Husky.

She wrote the following a few years ago to an on-line judges group requesting judges to explain the Essence of their breed. "The 'Mercedes' of the dog world. To be viewed with the understanding that along with all the beauty, they were 'designed' to perform their job effortlessly. Beyond type as spelled out in the standard, there is a confidence that is expressed in their eyes as they stand proudly aloof and secure. Standing at a free stack they appear as in suspended motion. This medium sized dog projects strength and vitality. Elegance without exaggeration, bone and substance without coarseness. All wrapped in a hard body with painted on skin and a coat that gleams as if hand rubbed to a fine shine. This is the picture in my mind of our wonderful breed."

John Marinos was fortunate to be exposed to many venues in the dog world from a young age. Even though his parents were not dog people he had aunts who bred and showed Dobermans and an uncle who was a member of the North American Schutzhund Association and trained his German Shepherds. He started going to shows at around the age of 10 years old and there after was handling dogs in the show ring. He purchased his first show dog in 1978 when he was 15 years old, a black bitch out of CH. Irish Whiskey of Aramis. He handled her at Westminster and his first Doberman national in 1982. While in high school and into college he worked as a Veterinary technician, and eventually became a New York City Police Officer, working as a patrol officer in Crown Heights Brooklyn, and in the organized crime control bureau in Washington Heights Manhattan. After retiring from the NYPD, he got back into dogs. He is the past Vice President of the Long Island Doberman Pinscher club and the current President of the Long Island German Shorthaired Pointer club. He currently handles dogs (mostly from the working group and sporting group). He's an AKC hunt test judge and can judge junior, senior and master hunter and a provisional junior showmanship judge (all Breeds). He's also an AKC CGC evaluator and an AKC K9 ambassador for Suffolk Obedience Training Club and a breed handling instructor for Suffolk Obedience. He owns 3 dogs, one Doberman Pinscher and two German Shorthaired pointers. He is active with all 3 in every aspect of competition and an avid bird hunter who hunts with all 3 dogs.

Sharon Marinelli (*Sharjet Dobermans*) Sharon has had dobermans since '79 and has been active with the breed since '81. She is a licensed AKC handler.

Dr. Nancy Morris received her Bachelor of Science degree in Medical Technology from Oregon Institute of Technology in 1985 where she graduated Magna Cum laude. The American Society of Clinical Pathologists certified her as a Medical Technologist (MT). She received her DVM degree in 1990 from Tufts University School of Veterinary Medicine. She served as a research technician for Frank Pipers, DVM, PHD in a project to validate echocardiography in dogs as a means to determine left ventricular volumes and ejection fraction using modified Simpson's approximation technique. Dr. Morris spent the next year at Angell Memorial Animal Hospital interning in small animal medicine and surgery. The next 7 years were spent in private practice. In 1997, Dr. Morris returned to Angell for a 2 year residency in cardiopulmonary medicine and she is a board certified Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ACVIM), specialist in cardiology. Recently Dr. Morris was the Medical Director and President of the Cape Animal Referral and Emergency Center LLC in South Dennis, MA. She is a partner in the CARE hospital and provided the creative vision for practice and business development, and managed the start-up of this multi-door, specialty hospital.

She has also been in cardiovascular research. She recently completed a multi-center FDAICVM clinical trial for a new Phosphodiesterase II inhibitor drug (Pimobendan) to treat congestive heart failure in dogs. She has served as a consultant to biotech, medical device manufacturer and pharmaceutical development companies such as the Genzyme Corp, Charles River Labs, Transoma, Viacor and Advanced Tissue Sciences.

John Soares' introduction to dog training was brought about at age 6 while staying with an uncle who bred and trained German Short Haired Pointers. In the late '80s he saw a KNPV (Dutch ring sport) demonstration which later led to his involvement in Sch/IPO. He is currently the training director for United Doberman Club, DPCA, Tri-State Doberman Club and Alpha Schutzhund Club. He is certified as a FCI helper (Europe), Belgian Malinois Helper (Italy) and United Schutzhund Club Regional Level Helper (USA). John is also a working judge for American Bulldog Federation and a former Working Dog Sport Judge (AKC).

John's achievements with Dobermans include: *Regional Level:* USA Northeast Regionals Sch I Champion 2000; USA Northeast Regionals Sch III Champion 2005; *National Level:* AWDF IPO III Vice Champion 2001, AWDF IPO II Champion 2004, AWDF IPO III Competitor 2006; *International Level:* World Team Qualifier in 2001(Slovenia) and 2005(France), IDC IPO III World Championship Team Captain in 2002 (Czech Republic), IDC IPO III World Championship Competitor in 2004 (Slovakia) and IDC IPO III World Championship 4th place 2005 (Germany), SAS FCI IPO III Championship 6th Place 2004(Switzerland) and AIAD IPO III Champion 1st Place 2005 (Italy).

Bonnie Wittrock Bonnie Wittrock has been breeding Dobermans for 42 years. Over the years she has worked closely with many veterinarians in ear cropping and ear aftercare, teaching seminars and individuals the process to succeed. She is well known for her expertise in the aftercare of cropped ears or ears that are required to stand. She has written a book on the subject that includes step by step instructions on how to do it yourself and an area for problem solving. Most vets in her area send their aftercare on cropped ears to her. She helps anyone with a breed that requires posting to get the ears to stand. *If you have a puppy available to use for demonstration please bring it and Bonnie will wrap the ears for you.*

Dogs must be 18 months or older, be of an allowed color (no albinos/whites) with z-factored dogs allowed after showing proof of spay/neuter, and must be AKC registered or have ILP/PAL or be AKC registerable. UDC BREED SURVEY on Friday, April 30th under Judge Ray Carlisle with panel
The UDC Breed Survey program uses one the UDC conformation standard with the following modifications, 1) No more than 2 missing teeth. 2) Veterinarian certification will be accepted as proof of lost teeth. 3) Uncropped and undocked dogs will not be penalized. 4) Spayed/Neutered dogs are permitted to test. The Breed Survey Basic "BSB" uses a protection scenario similar to the ATT. The Breed Survey Advanced "BSA" uses the protection scenario that includes attack out of the blind with stick hits and a courage test. A complete description of the revised Breed Survey is available at <http://www.uniteddobermanclub.com>. The same health tests must be submitted for the BSB and BSA. Copies of the following documents MUST accompany Breed Survey entry: working title, hip certificate (OFA or equivalent), VWD DNA, thyroid test (within 18 months). The CERF (within 18 months) and/or echocardiogram (within 18 months) may be turned in with entry OR at a later date. Each Doberman entered must also be UDC registered and have permanent identification (tattoo or microchip), have at least a BH for the BSA, a working title for the BSB (see UDC Conformation Rules). Copies of the supporting documents must accompany entry. Online entries must mail copies of the required documentation to Janis Toman, 308 Washington Ave., Milltown, NJ 08850 prior to the April 7th closing. Additional copies of all required documentation must be taken to the test site with UDC registration papers & UDC scorebook.

The 2010 UDC National IPO Trial will use the internationally accepted FCI-IPO rules effective January 1, 2003, for IPO1-3. Tracking (TR1-3) will use the rules for part A of the FCI-IPO1-3 respectively. Obedience (OB1-3) will use the rules for part B of the FCI-IPO1-3 respectively. We will use VDH approved rules for the BH, FH1-2, WH, AD, and STP. All of these rules may be downloaded free of charge from the DVG America website <http://www.dvgamerica.org>.

UDC BH test under FCI Judge Dr. Joseph M. Bulo on Saturday, May 1st
The BH (Begleithund) is a companion dog or traffic sureness test. Entries may be limited. 100% refund will be given if your entry is not accepted due to trial limitations.

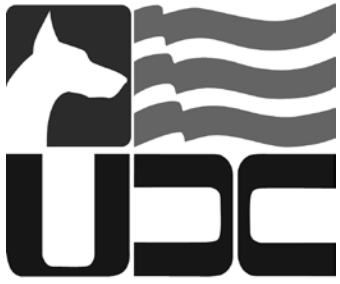
